
Relay For Life





CHILDREN'S CENTRE CELEBRATES THE LITTLE THINGS BONNIE KOGAS



Roy Eaton, a close friend, and a member of the Sudbury Shrine Club, sent me a sparkling photograph of three little children gleefully playing tiny drums at a party given by the Sudbury Regional Hospital's Children's Treatment Centre for the Sudbury Shrine Club in honour of their amazing donation. I could see such fun and laughter, I had to know more.

Even Sally Spence Clinical Manager at the Sudbury Regional Hospital's Children's Treatment Centre, had me laughing and appreciating the work that she and her staff do.

Last week the Shriners made a presentation of **\$51,000** to assist the Children's Treatment Centre, Sally and he staff hosted the celebration. She had a cake made shaped like a Fez. The children had a mini-parade and a rhythm band. "We're always touched and totally charmed by the kids," Barry Tooley, President of the Sudbury Shrine Club, tells me, "We work diligently to raise funds in various ways so we can transport the kids from Sudbury to Montreal."

Barry's been a member since 1990. "Being given the chance to help children is so rewarding just to see the results is a blessing for me. This touches each individual Shriner. We know we're doing something to help alleviate pain and problems in their future life. The purpose of the Shriner's Hospital in Montreal is to save children's lives and restore their bodies to the highest level of usefulness, research into orthopaedic and bun care, and education, training physicians and other professionals in disabilities."

Sally tell me "We serve close to 2,000 children both in urban and rural Ontario each year. We go as far west and north as Chapleau, and all communities between there and Sudbury.

We serve children in our Centre and we travel to schools to provide therapy.

"We're a community-based rehabilitation facility, offering physical therapy, occupational therapy, speech language therapy, and social work."

"We've enjoyed a decade-long partnership with the Shriners initiated by The Shrine Hospital in Montreal," says Sally.

"They send their paediatric orthopaedic surgeon, Dr. Reggie Hamdy, who has performed surgeries on hundreds of children in our area. Each time Dr. Hamdy holds a clinic at the Treatment Centre, he sees 40 to 50 kids, Shrine Club members are present to greet the families and to offer support transportation to and from Montreal, and be a resource to families in whatever way they can. The cover the cost of braces, and other necessary equipment."

"The Shriners have helped us with Botox, "Sally says. "Dr. Hamdy told us about the benefits in using Botox in the treatment of Cerebral Palsy. It has the paralytic effect on spastic muscles of children with CP. Those muscles that had to be previously surgically lengthened can now be relaxed through Botox injections, so surgery is not needed or delayed. Thanks to the Toronto Rameses Temple and our wonderful Sudbury Shrine Club, we've received **\$51,000** to provide the intensive therapy needed after Botox injections."

"One way we raise money is to collect and crush cans, and sell them to a scrap dealer," Barry says. "This save space in landfills and helps the Sudbury children. We also sell Christmas cakes and Vidalia onions to raise funds."

The Children's Treatment Centre is currently located off site in a rental facility, but will be returning to our Hospital's campus in a newly refurbished facility that will be ideal for our kids and families.

As manager, Sally deals with a lot of paperwork. "When I need a break, I walk 15 feet and sit in a classroom, surrounded by seven four-year old boys who yell "Sally!" "And I'm as glad to see them!"


