(PAST MASTER'S) Fourth Degree Working Tools

- 1. THE EMPTY BOTTLE
- 2. THE CORK
- 3. THE CORK SCREW

The bottle is a container for liquor and is formed hollow, the better to retain its contents. The outer shell or rim is made so thick that the profits on the contents is increased. It is made of molten glass and was cast in the clay grounds of Bermondsay. The superintendent of the casting was a profiteer.

The cork in its finest form acts as a capitor of the bottle. It is considered complete when a canopy of gold foil and wire is placed thereon.

The corkscrew is a small instrument sinuous in its form but of such exquisite temper as to compensate for the uncertainty of the hand that uses it too frequently. It is calculated to make an impression on the largest cork and the mightiest banquets have been indebted to its aid.

But we being A.F. & A.M. apply these tools to our morals. In this sense, the empty bottle is the symbol of the I.P.M., his services completed; his strength exhausted and his beauty utterly destroyed.

The cork teaches us that however hollow may be our lives, it is our duty to rise buoyant upon the waves of misfortune and depression.

The corkscrew is the emblem of optimism, and like the second marriage, shows the triumph of hope over experience. It is usually depicted in our lodges in the hands of a Scotsman wandering Ontario. Tradition informs us that these working tools were constantly in operation among our ancient brethren.

It is but the summing up of what has been intimated in the explanation to state that the fundamental principles and tenets of the fourth degree are: HILARITY: LOQUACITY: and CUBIC CAPACITY.



Located right next to the Masonic booth on each occasion is the Spanish River Chapter No. 237 of the Order of the Eastern Star.


In addition to providing information on the Eastern Star, they sold pies as one of their fund raising events.

THIS order appertains to the office of High Priest of a Royal Arch Chapter; and no one can be legally entitled to receive it, until he has been duly elected to preside as High Priest in a regular Chapter of Royal Arch Masons. Therefore the year 2001 becomes 3914.


