origins, From its which are lost in the time, mists of Freemasonry has cherished its ancient usages and customs, maintained its timeless core principles, and abided by its defining landmarks. Many of the traditions we honour are inherited



from the medieval operative stonemasons' guilds, and some can be traced back to the ancient mystery schools of Modern Freemasonry is an initiatory order engaged in assisting its initiates to realize their personal potential by guiding the serious seeker through a lifelong journey of self-discovery. In a series of ritual experiences that we call 'degrees' a man is challenged to ask, ponder and reflect upon those eternal questions: Where did I come from? What am I doing here? Where am I going from here? These questions are the essence of all spiritual meditation and growth.

The Rites and Ceremonies of Freemasonry are the means we use to transmit the philosophy of life unique to the Craft: fraternity, sociability, philanthropy, and above all, integrity and fidelity to the Truth. It is our Ritual that defines us as Free and Accepted Masons and distinguishes us from every other institution, society, or club in existence. For these reasons, during my term as Grand Master I have stressed the importance of Ritual excellence in our constituent lodges and encouraged the Masters and Officers to raise the standard of ritual performance.

We have always considered our Rites and Ceremonies to be the private property of the Craft, sacred and inviolable, for the simple reason that they must be experienced to be understood and internalized to be appreciated. Even a casual reading of Masonic history proves that from the beginning, there have been public 'exposures' of these Rituals. Only thirteen years after the formation of the premier Grand Lodge in England, Samuel Pritchard published Masonry Dissected [sic] in London, which gave a complete account of the three degrees. A surfeit of others soon followed. In North America, William Morgan, in 1826 published an exposure in Batavia, New York, with disastrous consequences to Freemasonry throughout the continent, and which has gained infamy as 'The Morgan Affair.' Today, Duncan's Ritual of Freemasonry first printed in the nineteenth century is on sale at major book stores. Needless to add that websites abound where Masonic Ritual is given for every degree that has ever existed as a quick Google search will soon prove.

Grand Lodges neither condone nor approve of these exposures. However, while regretting these breaches of trust, we have no control over such. Every Initiate takes a solemn oath never to reveal or divulge the essential parts of the Rites and Ceremonies he has experienced. In fact, to an outsider, the signs and words contained in the Ritual, while they may be a curiosity, are meaningless when taken out of context.

Recently, there have been unfounded allegations and false accusations widely and indiscriminately broadcast by an individual hiding behind a cloak of anonymity, for reasons known only to himself, and whose malevolent intent can only be assumed to be aimed at discrediting this Grand Lodge in general and the Grand Master in particular. Frustrated because we have chosen to ignore these documents, the level of invective has increased until it now borders on slander. Such salacious rumour and malicious gossip only serves to raise doubts in the minds of sincere Masons. In this nefarious exercise, this individual has been aided and abetted by the former Webmaster of the Grand Lodge whose personal vendetta festering for several years, has been sent out across the country by e-mail transmission. The result of which has sullied the otherwise long-established good reputation of this Grand Lodge. As a Mason, I am saddened and ashamed that such un-Masonic conduct and breach of trust emanates from one who ought to know better. To knowingly spread untruths is unbecoming of any man who professes to be a Freemason. Such disrespect and insolence directed against Masonic Authority will be addressed appropriately under the provisions of the Constitution.

Let me state clearly and in no uncertain terms. There is not, nor has there ever been, any intention by this Grand Master, or policy and plan considered by this Grand Lodge to publicly publish any or all of our Rites and Ceremonies. Our Ritual books are made available **only** to those members who are entitled to them.

As we travel through the daily round, we often encounter a man, who by his ethical demeanour and moral conduct is one that could be a Freemason, but who is not yet a member. In rare cases we come across a member who, by his actions, demonstrates that he is not a true Mason. It is not what we are, but who we are that defines each of us as a Freemason.

I call upon all members of the Craft in this Grand Jurisdiction to assist me to set the record straight, and rededicate ourselves to the timeless and timely principles of Brotherly Love, Relief, and Truth, the foundation upon which this great fraternity has been raised and maintained.

We are regularly attacked by indirect fire from rockets, but last night in concert with indirect fire there was a frontal ground attack on the base and we received word that the perimeter had been breached. The Worshipful Master calmly directed the Tyler to lock the door and put a round in the chamber of his M-4. This was done and we continued with the sound of warning sirens and explosions outside (when there is a rocket attack we are to stay under shelter anyway).

I am quite certain that in the history of Masonry the door of the lodge has rarely been Tyled in this way.

I am glad to report that I am safe, and that while there were Canadians injured last night in the attack last night, we did not suffer any loss of life.

Masonry is an organization that uses some ancient practices and symbols. It dates its lore and much of its symbolism from the Hebrew Bible, which Christians call the Old Testament.

Masonry, as we have it today, is in fact the last remnant of the guilds of medieval times. While the original potters, tinkers, and weavers guilds have long since disbanded, the guild that was the builders has morphed and evolved into modern Freemasonry.

Not that Masonry is particularly modern in either form or content. We have many left over practices that persist from a much older time. What this current form of the old builders guild has to offer is a kind of understanding and acceptance, which if properly understood and applied, goes far beyond ordinary tolerance.

Masonry often describes itself as an organization based on tolerance – both religious and personal. Freemasonry, properly practised and taught, will go far beyond that tolerance, to mutual respect and admiration, for all the differing points of view put before us.

The questions asked of the candidate at his initiation suggest something that is a critical part of many religious teachings, namely that our beliefs are the pass word, passport, and key to admission into the presence of God – Architect, Creator, and Preserver of all that we have, all that we see, all that we do not see, and all that we are, and if there were ever a pass grip worth having, it would be the loving hand by which God offers admission to all who believe and accept that love.

Every Freemason, and in fact every person who believes in the value of that beautiful spirit of mutual acceptance and respect, and who wants to take God's hand and feel God's loving grip, needs to worship regularly with others of belief and faith. The Great Architect of the Universe has greatly and generously blessed our fraternity.

As Craft Masonry is the foundation of the appendant bodies, then the rock on which our personal foundations are built is our Temple, Church, Synagogue or Mosque, and your lodge can't replace that. Nothing betrays our Masonic principles quite the same way as going to lodge but not to church. Psalm 116: 12-14 says, "How shall I repay the Lord for all the good things God has done for me? I will lift up the cup of salvation and call upon the name of the Lord. I will fulfill my vows to the Lord in the presence of all God's people". Go and worship in your faith community!

He was wounded in action three times and was a number one soldier with the medals to show. He was the guard in charge of "Nazi S.S. Major General Kirk Meyer" who was charged for giving the orders to shoot 18 soldiers from Lloyd's regiment.

Lloyd was a member of the Royal Canadian Legion Branch #564 Lockerby, the War Pensioners of Canada, the Veterans UN-NATO Canada, Nickel Lodge No. 427 AF & AM, the Order of the Eastern



Star Algoma Chapter No. 139, Rameses Shriners, the Sudbury Shrine Club, Oriental Band and the INCO Quarter Century Club. He was well known for his charming personality and great sense of humour. Lloyd was in every sense the Ideal of a Freemason and he will be missed by all who knew and loved him.

Lloyd leaves behind the love of his life Sylvia, and children Lloyd Jr., Alfred, Allen Paul, Gary, Craig, Dennis, Dale, Wanda, Beverley and Marilyn. 


