There are two seas in Palestine

One is fresh, and fish are in it. Splashes of green adorn its banks. Trees spread their branches over it and stretch out their thirsty roots to sip of its healing waters.

A long its shores the children play, as children played when He was there. He loved it. He could look across its silver surface when He spoke His parables, and on the rolling plain not far away fed five thousand people.

The river Jordan makes this sea with sparking waters from the hills so it laughs in the sunshine. And men build their houses near to it. and birds their nests; and every kind of life is happier because it is there.

The river Jordan flows south into another sea.

Here is no splash of fish, no fluttering leaf, no song of birds no children's laughter. Travellers choose another route, unless on urgent business. The air hangs heavy above its waters, and neither man or beast nor fowl will drink.

What makes this mighty difference in these neighbor seas? Not the river Jordan. It empties the same good water into both.

This is the difference. The Sea of Galilee receives but does not keep the Jordan. For every drop that flows into it another, drop flows out. The giving and receiving go on in equal measure. The other sea is shrewder, hording its income jealously. It will not be tempted into any generous impulse. Every drop it gets, it keeps.

The Sea of Galilee gives and lives, this other sea gives nothing. It is named The Dead.

R.W. Bro. John Hodder of Doric Lodge No. 455 named 2010 Senior of the Year in North-Eastern Manitoulin

NORTHEAST TOWN — He's given his time to education, politics, marine tourism, economic development—and that's just the tip of the iceberg. For these and all the contributions John Hodder has made to the community, the Northeast Town has named him **'2010 Senior of the Year'**.

The annual award is bestowed upon a mature member of the community who has worked, and continues to strive, to make the municipality a better place to live, work, and visit. Northeast Town Councillor Marcel Gauthier said the recognition is a unique way in which the community can show its thanks to its senior volunteers for all they do.

"It gives me great pleasure to stand before you and say a few words about the recipient of the Senior of the Year award in our municipality this year," he said during a recent council meeting. "During my two terms on council I've always enjoyed doing this, because it shows the importance of having our seniors and having them recognized for all the various things they've done over the years."

As one who has personally worked with Mr. Hodder over the years, Councillor Gauthier commented on the breadth and depth of commitments Mr. Hodder has made to the community. After completing undergraduate and master's degrees in education, Mr. Hodder spent several years educating the community's youth, first as a teacher at Little Current Public School, and later serving as principal. He is a member of the Little Current United Church, the Little Current Curling Club, and has been a Mason since 1972. "He's also had a distinguished political career," noted Councillor Gauthier, referencing Mr. Hodder's six years as a Little Current councillor and nine years as mayor.

Amongst the volunteer positions he has held are president and executive member of the Federation of Northern Ontario Municipalities (FONOM), chair of the Manitoulin Economic Development Committee, chair of the North Channel Marine Tourism Council, a member of the Northern Ontario Heritage Fund Corporation, and a member of the board of directors for the Owen Sound Transportation Company. He additionally held the position of administrator at the Manitoulin Centennial Manor, has done consulting work in conjunction with the Improvement Little Current Business Area on enhancements for the waterfront, and has worked with the cruise ship industry.

"As you can see, he's been pretty busy," said Councillor Gauthier. "I think John is a very worthy recipient of this award."

In accepting the award, R.W. Bro. Hodder, who was humbled by the acknowledgement, thanked the support of his family, which includes his wife, Glenda, three children, and eight grandchildren, many of whom were in attendance to see him receive his award. "I accept this with humility," he said, "because I represent a whole raft of people in the community who are also volunteers and do senior things."

Joking that he would keep his comments short since the council meeting was only scheduled to run quipped, "all the meetings I chaired were done by 8:30." While the list of contributions merely touches on some of the causes and organizations with which Mr. Hodder has been involved, he noted that helping out in the community is easy if one makes a simple commitment. "It just shows you that you can, if you wish, be committed to the community, and I think I am," he said. "Therefore, I appreciate this with all humility."


