






<u>Right Worshipful Brother James Mackay Thomson</u>
Biography Of An Astute Freemason

When you first meet Jim Thomson, you soon realize that this quiet, soft-spoken man is someone you must take seriously. He has the rare ability to assess a problem, develop a solution then make things happen by setting the plan to work so that it gets carried through to a successful conclusion. This obviously is a skill developed in his career but has benefitted Masonry and related bodies greatly.


Jim was born October 29, 1936 in Edinburgh, Scotland, to Thomas Thomson and Janet (Mackay).



Jim worked for the National Coal Board from 1953 to 1966, then Lothian Education Board from 1966 to 1967. At this point, everything in the Scottish economy was shrinking and Jim along with many others found himself out of work. This had to be a heavy responsibility for Jim especially since he had a family. Jim took a very bold step at this critical point in his life and immigrated to Canada with a wife, three young children and no job.

In Canada, he met a man who, when Jim told him he was looking for work and that he had a background and training in ventilation for mines, advised Jim he should contact Inco in Sudbury. When he contacted Inco, it turned out that they were not only hiring but were having a lot of difficulty getting people who were experienced and trained in mining. The contact person told Jim that if he came to Sudbury, he was hired.

So began a thirty-one year career with Inco, that saw him rise from Ventilation Engineer to Mining Engineer to Foreman to General Foreman to Project Manager, which is the job he retired from in 1998.



Jim is a very big football fan (soccer to the uninitiat_{ed}). He played pretty much all his life, until the years caught up with him, but Jim still enthusiastically follows his favourite teams. Teams such as Scottish Hearts, Manchester United and Stoke are a few of those favourites.

Jim was initiated into Masonry as a member of Bethel Lodge in March 1992, after being Passed, and Raised, he went on to serve as Master of Bethel Lodge in 1998. In 2002-2003 he served with wisdom and dignity as District Deputy Grand Master for the Sudbury, Manitoulin District. He has served in most offices in Scottish Rite, being elevated to the 33°. In York Rite, he is member of Conclave. He is currently Treasurer of Tuscan Chapter No. 95 in Sudbury.

Jim has four children and three grandchildren.

Jim and Bola married twenty-seven years ago. They are enjoying their retirement together. Bola and Jim enjoy socializing at the Polish Hall, and at Masonic related dinners and functions.


