How to Join.

The Orders of the Masonic Knights Templar are a part of a progression from the first three degrees of Freemasonry. Membership thus involves several prerequisites:

- You must have received the Supreme Degree of the Holy Royal Arch of Jerusalem, the final degree of royal Arch Masonry, and be a member in good standing of a Chapter of royal Arch Masons.
- Membership in a Royal Arch Chapter requires that you have been raised as a Master Mason in a Craft Lodge and be a member in good standing of a Masonic Craft Lodge.



Therefore, an applicant must be:

1. A Freemason in good standing with his Craft Lodge;
2. A Royal Arch Mason in good standing with his Chapter, and
3. A Christian, recommended by two members of the Order, who profess a belief in the "Christian Doctrine of the Holy and Undivided Trinity of The Father, The Son and The Holy Spirit."

### Sudbury-Manitoulin District Project 2470

**The Project is to raise awareness of diabetes and raise funds for the Canadian Diabetes Association.** It is recognized by Grand Lodge and the Masonic Foundation of Ontario under Project # 2470.

**Diabetes is a chronic, often debilitating and sometimes fatal** disease in which the body either cannot produce insulin or cannot properly use the insulin it produces. ## Order of the Eastern Star Algoma Chapter No. 139

The General Grand Chapter, Order of the Eastern Star, was organized by a convention of delegates of independent Grand Chapters (the jurisdictional bodies over chapters in states or provinces) on the fifteenth and sixteenth days of November 1876. The official title of the organization is: **General Grand Chapter, Order of the Eastern Star**. The office of the General Grand Chapter is located in the International Headquarters. (also known as the International Temple) in Washington DC. The General Grand Chapter (GGC) serves as the hub for chapters; such as Algoma Chapter in Sudbury and Spanish River Chapter in Little Current, subordinate to the GGC and the Grand Jurisdictions; such as the Grand Chapter O.E.S. Ontario Canada Inc. General Grand Chapter is led by a Most Worthy Grand Matron and a Most Worthy Grand Patron. These are elected positions and their term of office is three years. There are three offices through which the Most Worthy Grand Matron must serve, enroute to becoming the leader. Each is a three year term. (That is twelve years.) The Most Worthy Grand Patron has a bit shorter route, with two previous offices of three years each. In most cases they have served a three year term in some other capacity at General Grand Chapter. General Grand Chapter Officers are elected and appointed from the ranks of the Past Grand Matrons and Past Grand Patrons of the various Grand Jurisdictions. General Grand Chapter Committee Members are appointed from the ranks of the Past Grand Matrons and Past Grand Patrons of the Grand Jurisdictions. Prior to their ascending to the offices of Most Worthy Grand Matron and Patron, they are hold the title of Right Worthy Associate Grand Matron or Patron. With the permission of the Most Worthy Grand Matron; the Right Worthy Associate Grand Matron and Patron are allowed to announce their appointments of Officers and Committee Members.

Right Worthy Associate Grand Matron, Mrs. Barbara "Bobbi" White (P.G.M. of West Virginia) and Acting Most Worthy Grand Patron John E. Grobler (P.G.P. of Washington State) have recently announced (most of ) their appointments, who will be serving the General Grand Chapter for the Triennium 2012-2015.

Bro. Grobler is in this "acting" position due to the passing of the M.W.G.P.

These appointments will become effective November 8th 2012, in Fort Worth Texas.

Mrs. Helen Delaney, P.G.M., a member of Orangeville Chapter No. 197 will be a General Grand Chapter Officer in the role of Worthy Grand Martha.

Four members will serve as General Grand Chapter Committee Members.

Mr. Brian Hester, a member of Gore Bay Lodge No. 472 and a P.G.P., of Algoma Chapter No. 139 in Sudbury and Spanish River Chapter No. 237 in Little Current will serve on the Cancer Committee.


