Faith and Commitment

### R.W. Bro. Saliem J. Khoury (Sam) Biography Of A Honourable Freemason Friendship Lodge No. 691

Sam Khoury is a principled man and they are the guide by which he lives his life. One of the most important to him is, "Treat others the way you want to be treated". It was very apparent when he and I sat down for a discussion of his life story that his principles were such a strong part of his story. The other thing was how important his family is to him. The way he lit up talking about them was very refreshing. One could tell that his wife, Lori, his daughter Leila (she is 13 years old), as well as his older children (the oldest of whom is 30) along with a newborn Grandson, Elliot, were a very strong priority.

While we sat in his kitchen/family room in his beautiful home on the shores of Ramsey Lake, I was made very welcome. We looked out over Ramsey Lake with its wonderful vistas, we had a fascinating discussion about Sam's life and times.



His very strong work ethic began to show itself when he came to Canada at the age of seventeen from his native Lebanon. When Sam came to Canada, he lived with his aunt, who had a home in Sudbury. He arrived here June 11, 1971, on a Friday. His Aunt and the rest of his local family immediately took him for a Barbeque at Richard Lake.

Once he was settled in, he started his Canadian education at Sudbury High School. He spoke no English when he arrived so he started night school to learn the English language. Between learning a new language in the evening and achieving a high school education at the same time, he clearly showed he could take a heavy workload, stay organized and finish the job.

It was while he attended Sudbury High School that he met his best friend, Bro. John Miszczack. John has just recently joined Masonry and that has pleased Sam very much. When he and John met at Sudbury High School, John took Sam home and introduced him to his family, where they promptly adopted Sam as one of their own. They have remained close ever since. Sam still calls John's parents "Mama" and "Tata" (Polish terms).

The important facts of Sam's life are that he was born in Lebanon, which at the time (1971) was considered to be one of the real beauty spots of the world with very strong cultural, business and tourist development. It was known unofficially as the "Paris of the Mediterranean" until 1975, when civil war broke out.

We are all aware of the tragedy that has occurred since then in Beirut and Lebanon, generally.

Sam was born into a family of nine children as the youngest child of Jamil and Basma. Jamil, his father passed away only seven months after Saliem's birth, leaving his mother Basma, to raise the family with only the help of her oldest son, George, who had already joined the army.

After relocating to Canada and finishing High School, in June 1974. That same month, he began his career with Inco (now Vale). It was meant to be a summer job but he ended up staying on. He worked mostly in the surface plant and in 1982 began working as a Welder Apprentice. He suffered a serious back injury in 1994, and transferred to the Safety Department of the Divisional Shop, where he stayed until his retirement in January 2005 with service of thirty years (and 211 days). He began working with a group of companies as a Safety Coordinator and Trainer and retired a second time June 3, 2011.

Sam married Lori, his greatest supporter and motivator. They have six children, in order from oldest to youngest: Jamil, Toni, Natasha, Nina, Elisha and Leila, (who refers to Lodge as Dad's second home) and since this Easter Sunday, grandson Elliot.

While Lori is very busy between keeping their home, raising children and managing her own Hair Salon. This has been located conveniently in her home. She also attends any function with Sam that include the ladies. She is very encouraging to Sam and he mentioned it often during our visit, which is no small sacrifice on her part considering his involvement as DDGM of the Sudbury-Manitoulin District this year and currently District 47 Chairperson for the Lion's Club in Area 5, as well.

"When you want to get something done, give it to the busiest person you know" is a fairly common axiom of management people and that surely might have originated because of Sam's ability to manage a very busy schedule and yet when asked, seems to always be able to say, "Tell me what you need".



Sam was initiated into Friendship Lodge #691, November 24, 1976, and went on to become the 50th Master of Friendship Lodge in 2007. He served a second term as Master in 2010. He received the Harold Waller Award for "Commitment to the Craft" in 2009.

He is a Member of The Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite, after receiving the 14th Degree in the Valley of North Bay and his 18th Degree in the North Bay Chapter of the Rose Croix, then going on to receive his 32nd Degree from the Ottawa Consistory in 1986.

Sam began his York Rite passage when he became a Royal Arch Mason with Tuscan Chapter #95 in 2010, then becoming a Member of the Royal and Select Master of Ontario, Alpha Council #23 in 2011. He became a Member of The Ramses Sudbury Shrine Club in 1991.



Sam joined the Sudbury Northeast Lion's Club (now Minnow Lake Lion's Club), April 15, 1986. He has served four terms as President, one year as Treasurer and has sat on most of the committees. He has served eighteen on MCTV/Lion's Club Telethons and for the past three years has served as the head of the Telephone Committee.

This exceptional level of service has earned him the highest award that can be given to a Lion's Club Member, the Melvin Jones Award in 1999, for his "commitment and dedication to his community for Humanitarian Services and Assistance".



He has also received the Club's Honorary Award and for the last 25 years 100% Attendance Pins. He went on to become District 47 East Chairperson in 2010-2011 and currently is Region # 47 Chairperson for 2011-2012. Along with his very busy schedule as DDGM for Sudbury-Manitoulin District in Masonry, he and Lori are headed to Sault Ste Marie for the A5 Cabinet Meeting and he is taking part in the Memorial Service and Election in April for the Lion's Club. Sam and Lori are really looking forward to their trip to Lebanon this summer. They have been going back to Lebanon every other year for a while now to visit his family. He enjoys travel, swimming, snorkeling and reading Masonic literature and Ritual.

To sum up the life of Sam Khoury, as stated at the beginning, you must view him as a man of principle, who does not abide doing less than the right thing, who



who believes in the necessity for following the letter of the Ritual as it comes from Grand Lodge, and I believe by extension, the laws of the land.



He is a great resource to those of us in Masonry because you know that when you ask for advice or help that what you receive may not be what you want to hear, but it will be the right and proper information, because it will have come from the book.



The story of the life of Saliem Khoury goes on. There is lots to write about yet to come.
