### THE 100 MILLION DOLLAR CLUB

**It takes over \$3.3 million dollars a day** to operate the 22 Shriners Hospitals for Children. The medical care given through this Shriners Hospital network has cured or substantially helped more than 700,000 children - without cost to them or their families.
