District Chaplain's Observations

Old adages, or old sayings, have more depth to them than we often think. Such as: Life is what you make it, or...Lost time is never found, or...What's good for the goose is good for the gander.

The saying that has always intrigued me is: You can take a horse to water, but you can't make him drink.

When we think of all the possibilities in life that we were offered, from friends, mates, employment, leisure, sports, religion etc. we can't help but wonder "what if". Like the horse that wouldn't drink, we wouldn't listen, or accept, or understand what was offered to us. The doors to learning were opened, we just didn't open our minds.

We think of the clergy who every Sunday prepare a nice sermon that will induce you to live a better life. In Sudbury only 5 percent of the population goes to church. Of those five percent, how many actually digest the sermon and put it into practice. Or how many are there just because it looks good to attend and make your weekly contribution?

Masonry is not dissimilar; From the time you enter the lodge as an Apprentice, every talk and every action is meant for you to learn a new way of life. Masonry claims to take good men and make them better, but we can only make them better if they open their minds and hearts to what is being taught. From the start, the symbolism of the apparel of the apprentice must be understood part of which is explained in scripture in Ruth 4:7, and means that you are making and sealing a deal with the brethren.

District Chaplain (continued)


Masonry, when properly instilled in a man, sets him apart from other men. You are different and should be seen by the public as being different. It's not the ring on your finger or the decal on your car that makes you different. It's the way you live your life, your actions, that will establish you as a man to whom the burdened heart can pour out its sorrow, to whom the distressed can turn to, whose hand is guided by justice and whose heart is expanded by benevolence.

There is a scripture reading in the King James Bible that offers a similar content which I have enjoyed. It is 1st Peter, verse 23-25.

"You are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, you have been called out of darkness into the wonderful light."

As Masons we should consider our selves as a chosen people. We are now different, we have been taught the true values of life, we have been elevated above the normal man - but only those who have truly accepted the teachings in the lessons.

So similar to the horse to water saying, we can take good men into our lodge but we can't make them learn. We can offer the better way of life, but they must acknowledge it.







An explanation of the origin of the Grand Honours may be found in Bro. Harry Carr's book, "The Freemason at Work", (Seventh and Revised Edition), pages 375-376.

The Code for extending them is described in Section 15 of our Book of Constitution.

All members who are present in the lodge, (including the W.M.), give the Grand Honours, while those who are receiving them, (and those accompanying the recipients), stand at the S. of F.


