

From the Grand Lodge:

I draw your attention to the January 2023 GL Resource & Event Digest.

One item that is stressed is the obvious need to "practice" for the various ceremonies and activities in your Lodge. When confronted with the total body of the work, the rituals and protocols etc. it looks like an impossible challenge. However, by establishing an agenda (curriculum) to be added as a part of Masonic Education for your regular meetings you might be pleasantly surprised by the results.

A good place to start is played by the Inner Guard and Tyler. That is for receiving guests, and candidates and answering the "alarm". Break the process in 3 or 4 elements before trying attempt the full process. Always remember that the inner guard is answering an "ALARM"! So it is vital that everyone knows that there is an ALARM - speak up! The Lodge may be in the process of being invaded by Cowan's. And the person wishing entrance to the Lodge needs to realize that the Lodge is well guarded against unwanted intruders.

The Tyler, Inner Guard AND the Junior Warden should write down who a special visitor is when a formal introduction is expected. Check the website below for some important information.. Go on to other aspects of the "work" as necessary for degrees etc. And it might be expedient to have members "shadow" existing officers of your lodge as backup(s).

R.W. Bro. Sam Khoury (past District Deputy Grand Master - 2012) heard the following special words when he and every Freemason first entered a Masonic Lodge - that you declared "....a sincere wish to make yourself more extensively serviceable to your fellow creatures". This pledge R.W. Bro. Khoury took very seriously to heart and it has become a lifelong commitment.

Besides embracing the ideals of Freemasonry he put it into further practice by joining the now Minnow Lake Lions Club in 1986 which enabled him to focus a good portion of his attention on the service programs that the Lions are famous for. He served as the President of the 'Club 4 times, Treasurer once and served on every 'Club Committee. In 2002 he received the Robert (Bob) Ogilvy Honorary Award and Life Membership of the Lions Foundation of Canada. "Lion Sam", in 2009, also received the Melvin Jones Fellowship Award from his - the Minnow Lake Lions Club. In 2010 he was appointed Zone 47 East Chairperson and in 2011 he became Zone 47 Region Chairperson. In 2012 R.W. Bro. Sam Khoury received the Queen Elizabeth II Diamond Jubilee Medal from the Sudbury Multicultural and Folk Arts Association.

His outstanding record extends to working on the CTV/Lions Children's Telethon for the past 34 years and as Chairperson for the past 10 years. And 16 years as the Telethon's Telephone Chairperson. The Children's Telethon has raised hundreds of thousands of dollars for the needy children in our extended community - in 2022 \$310,000 alone!

Lion Sam Khoury emphasizes that the tremendous success of the Children's Telethon is the result of the time and dedication given by the members of ALL the various Lions Clubs in our region. On March 1, 2018 Lion Sam Khoury received the Community Builders Award Hall of Fame from Northern Life and Eastlink on behalf the Lions Clubs in the area for the Lions Children Christmas Telethon.



Most Reverend William Lockridge Wright, DD, DCL, LLD, Archbishop of Algoma and Metropolitan of Ontario (1904 - 1990)

Grand Master (1955-56 and 1956-57) of the Grand Lodge A.F. & A.M. of Canada in the Province of Ontario



(1904-1990)

William Lockridge Wright was born at Roslin, Ontario on September 8, 1904. His great-grandfather, William Wright, was a Dublin land surveyor who came to Montreal in 1842. His son, William, entered the ministry and served as a missionary in the Diocese of Ontario. (This William married Sarah Josephine de Pencier, a granddaughter of Theodore de Pencier, a descendant of a French military family and one of the first land surveyors in Canada, who in 1792 had surveyed St. Joseph Island—which became part of the Diocese of Algoma—and the St. Mary's River.) William and Sarah's son, John de Pencier Wright, became Canon and Priest of the Diocese of Ontario. (This John married Lucy Lockridge in 1903. Lucy was the daughter of Robert Lockridge of Tamworth and they had several children, the eldest being William Lockridge Wright).

William Lockridge Wright was educated at the public schools at Lyn and Kingston (his father being Rector of St. Luke's Church for a number of years), Kingston Collegiate, Queen's University and University of Toronto (graduating in Divinity in 1927). He had been ordained as a Deacon in 1926 and Priest in 1927, at St. George's Cathedral, Kingston. He would serve as Curate at the Church of St. George the Martyr in Toronto (1926-28), Tweed (1928-32) and Christ's Church, Hamilton (1932-36). He was chosen as the Rector of St. Luke's Pro-Cathedral in Sault Ste. Marie (1940) and as Dean of Algoma (1941, when he also received the degree of Doctor of Divinity, *jure dignitatis*, from the University of Toronto). In 1944 he was elected by the Synod of Algoma as Bishop of the Diocese and consecrated on May 30, 1944. In June 1953 he received the D.C.L. degree from Bishop's University. On April 20, 1955 the House of Bishops of the Ecclesiastical Province of Ontario elected him as Metropolitan of the Province. He was enthroned as Archbishop in St. Luke's Cathedral, Sault Ste. Marie on June 9, 1955 (just prior to his installation as Grand Master of the Grand Lodge A.F. & A.M. of Canada in the Province of Ontario.

In 1936 he married Miss Margaret Clare, a graduate of the University of Toronto (daughter of Rev. David Clare of Orillia). They had two sons and two daughters: Clare, John, Peter and Jane. Mrs. Margaret Wright died on March 3, 1988 in Sault Ste. Marie. Grand Master Wright died on January 19, 1990 and both he and Mrs. Wright are buried in the West Korah Cemetery, Sault Ste. Marie.

Masonic Career

Reverend William Lockridge Wright was initiated into Tweed Lodge, No. 239 GRC, Tweed on November 26, 1929. After his transfer to Hamilton he affiliated with The Barton Lodge, No. 6 Hamilton on December 13, 1933 and, in the Sault, he affiliated with Hatherly Lodge, No. 625 Sault Ste. Marie on April 17, 1942, and served as WM of Hatherly Lodge (1944, 1945 and 1946). He was appointed as Grand Chaplain (1947-48) and appointed (1948) and elected (1952-53 and 1953-54) to the Board of General Purposes. He was elected as Deputy Grand Master (1953-54 and 1954-55) and as Grand Master (1955-56 and 1956-57). His obituary notice in the Annual Proceedings of 1990 note that "he was affiliated with 10 other Lodges" and that he was appointed as "Grand Representative of the Grand Lodge of England."

He was a member of Algonquin Royal Arch Chapter, No. 102 GRC, Sault Ste. Marie.

He was a member of the Lodge of Perfection and a member and Most Wise Sovereign of the Chapter of Rose Croix, in Sault Ste. Marie. He was a member of Moore Sovereign Consistory, Hamilton. He was coroneted as an Honorary Inspector General 33° (1953) and crowned as an Active Member (1958).

He was a member of the Royal Order of Scotland.




