Cold Weather Means Destination Travel

As January ends and February begins I am sure some of you are all thinking of warm places to travel and the ones that are lucky enough (like myself this year) will be following through. Just a reminder that if you are traveling, especially to somewhere tropical and you are thinking of donating, you may have a time restriction before you are able to donate. Because of my destination having a risk of Zika Virus I have to wait 21 days before I am able to donate.

Please remember to check on the website or call the donation center if you are traveling and you are unsure if you are destination is an area that will restrict you from making your next donation for some time.

The second thing that I have to admit is that because of my trip I did not have as much time to put into this article as I normally would so I am going to include some general information about plasma from the Canadian Blood Services website, and as always if you have not donated and are interested in the process please check out the website at blood.ca, email me at 78cakennedy@gmail.com or contact the plasma donation center to find the answers.

What is plasma?

More than half (55 per cent) of the blood flowing through your veins is actually plasma. Plasma supports your immune system and helps other blood components (red blood cells, white blood cells and platelets) circulate through your body. This protein-rich, pale-yellow fluid has earned its nickname "liquid gold" because it can be transfused directly into patients in urgent situations, such as severe infection and excessive bleeding, or it can be manufactured into medications, like immunoglobulins.

Thousands of patients in Canada depend on immunoglobulins to treat primary and secondary immunodeficiency, autoimmune disorders, neurological conditions, and other diseases with an immune origin. Immunoglobulins are the most widely used medication made from plasma and demand for these lifesaving medications is growing in Canada and around the world.

How is plasma used?

Plasma has two main applications, it can be transfused directly into patients in hospitals; or, it can be manufactured into specialized medications called plasma protein products.

Immunoglobulins, albumin and coagulating factors are examples of these products.

What is the plasma donating process like?

The process for donating plasma is similar to donating blood. The main difference between a whole blood and plasma donation is the collection method—apheresis. Only the plasma portion of your blood is collected; the rest (red cells, white cells and platelets) is returned to you.

Who is eligible to donate?

Plasma can be donated as frequently as every 7 days for male and every 14 days for female. All blood types are needed. You can donate plasma if you:

Weigh over 50kg (110 lb.) Are in general good health Are 17 years of age or older Meet the eligibility criteria

Project Chairman Greg Blomme said: "We collect the clothing over the Christmas period to be delivered in time for the coldest months of the year". The "Red Coats" were delighted with the large amount of clothing delivered in timely fashion before the "cold weather" alerts began that would leave the most vulnerable people in our community at serious risk.
